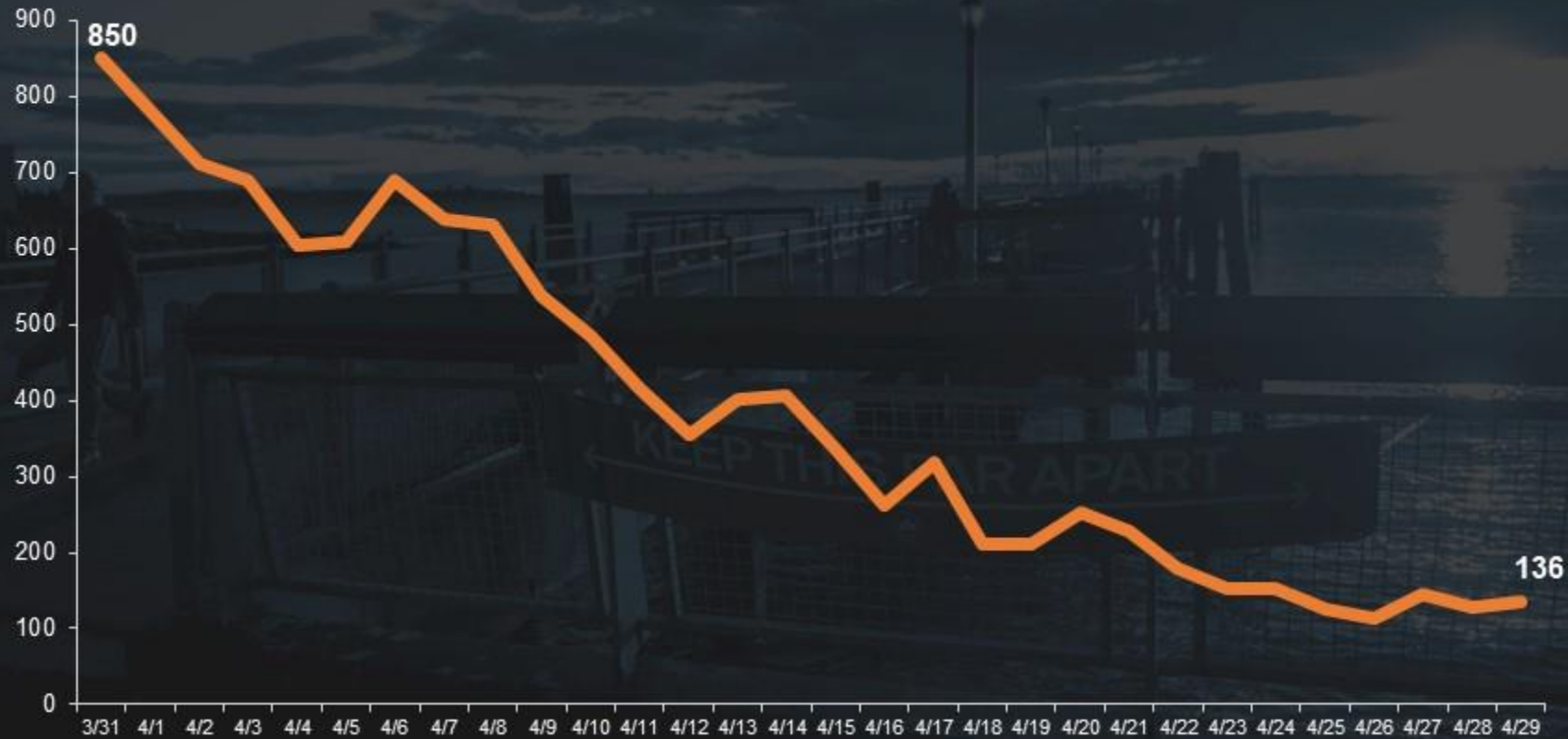


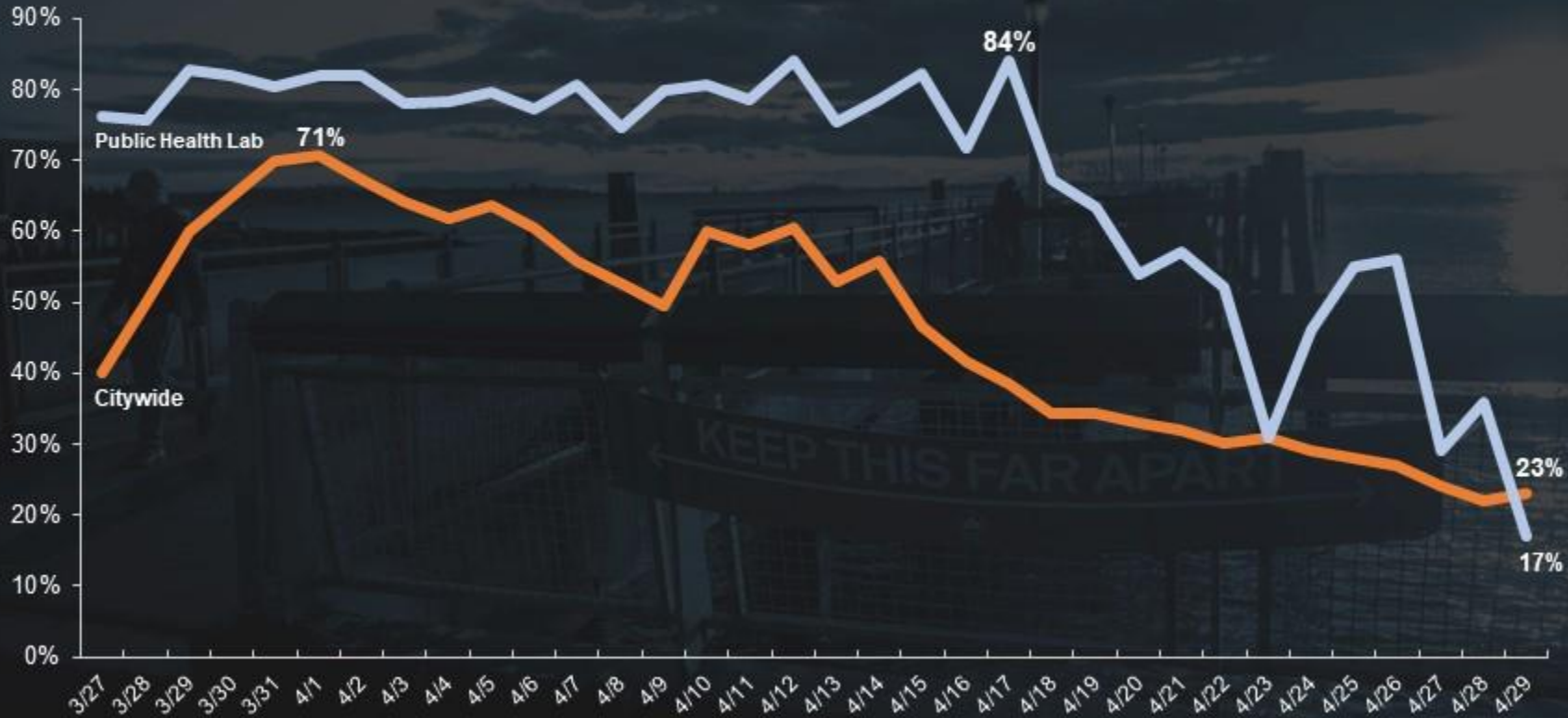

- 136  (129 as of April 28)

### People currently in H+H ICUs for suspected COVID-19

- 704  (705 as of April 28)

### Percentage of people tested who are positive for COVID-19

- Citywide: 23%  (22% as of April 28)
- Public Health Lab: 17%  (36% as of April 28)
