CURFEW ENDED

New York City is ending its curfew, effective immediately

5 days without significant property damage

Only 4 arrests, 24 summonses during yesterday's protests

Restart begins TOMORROW, Monday, June 8

KEEP THIS FAR APART

NEXT WAVE OF REFORM

1. Shift funding from NYPD to youth and social services
2. Reform 50-A: Transparency in police discipline
3. Move vendor enforcement out of NYPD
4. Bring community voices into senior level of NYPD

SHIFT FUNDING FROM NYPD TO YOUTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES

Budget will be passed this month

Focus funding on youth development and social services for communities of color

TRANSPARENCY IN POLICE DISCIPLINE

City supports reform of 50-A in Albany this week

Must make public when, how and why an officer is being disciplined

Sensitive personal information of officers protected

MOVE VENDOR ENFORCEMENT OUT OF NYPD

Police should focus on crime

City will shift enforcement for street vending out of NYPD

Furthers de-escalation agenda by reducing interactions with uniformed officers, especially in immigrant communities and communities of color

REAL COMMUNITY AMBASSADORS WITHIN NYPD

**City will bring community voices into senior levels of NYPD
by hiring community ambassadors**

Insight into ongoing processes

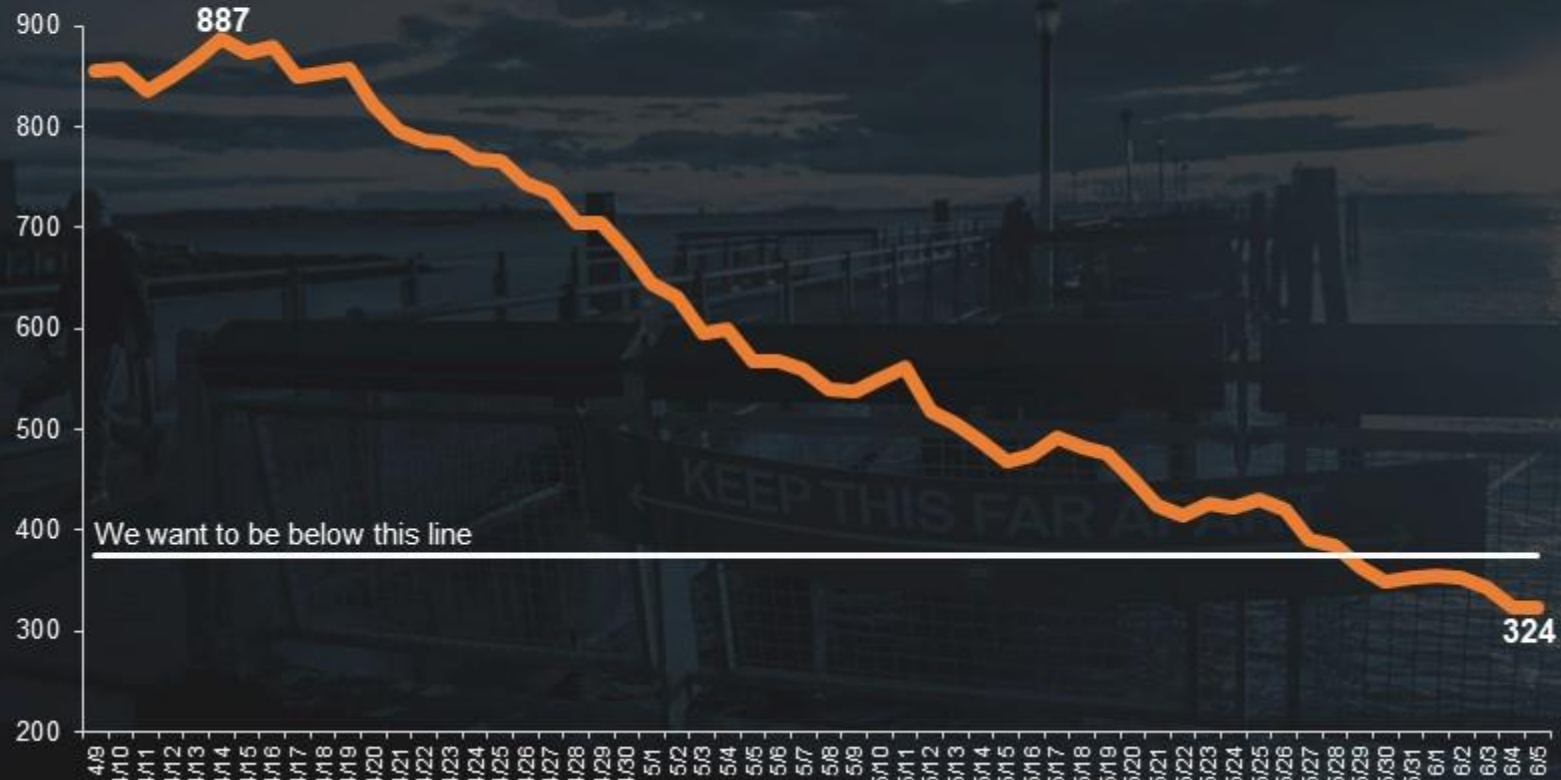
Obligation to report to families, victims and communities about
