### Language

<b>Statutory Language</b>	the defendant gratuitously reported to a law enforcement officer and agency the alleged occurrence of an offense and incident which did not in fact occur and he knew the information reported, conveyed and circulated was false and baseless.
<b>Complaint Language</b>	<p>I am informed by Rebekah Miranda, a 911 dispatcher employed by the NYPD, that on May 25, 2020, at approximately 8:17 am, she spoke with an individual who identified herself as Amy Cooper. Ms. Cooper told her, in substance, that an African American man "tried to assault" her inside the Rambles, and that the man took treats out and tried to lure her dog over to him.</p> <p>I then arrived at the exit of the Rambles in Central Park a few minutes after, and met the defendant, Amy Cooper, who told me, in substance, that she was the female who had called 911 stating that a man threatened her and in a second call indicated that the man "tried to assault her." I asked the defendant if the man tried to assault or touch her in any way, and she said no.</p>
